Baden-Württemberg SCHOLARSHIP 2017/18 for students from Developing Countries

By increasing the funds for the Baden-Württemberg SCHOLARSHIP, the Baden-Württemberg Foundation aims at promoting the exchange between the universities in Baden-Württemberg and Developing Countries starting in 2017/18.

Applications are possible for Master and PhD students from a selection of Developing Countries who wish to attend the University of Hohenheim for studies or research in the Academic Year 2017/18.

The following Developing Countries are eligible:

- all African countries
- all ACP countries according to the list
- all Least Developed Countries according to the list
- further eligible countries: India, Vietnam, Palestine, Bolivia, Colombia, Peru, Venezuela

Scholarships

- duration: 2 - 10 months, Scholarships may be prolonged for the Academic Year 2018/19 depending on the availability of funds
- Allowance: 500 Euro/month for Master students, 1000 Euro/month for PhD students
- Scholarship holders will be exempt from the tuition fees for international students

Application documents:

- Letter of application with information on studies and career to date
- Transcript of grades or certificate, confirmation of enrolment at home university if applicable
- Admission letter of the University of Hohenheim (Master students), invitation letter by a professor of the University of Hohenheim (PhD students)
- foreign language knowledge necessary for the study period

Application procedure:

Please send your complete application by eMail to austausch@verwaltung.uni-hohenheim.de (in one pdf file) no later than November 15, 2017.

There is a two-step application procedure: The University of Hohenheim will carry out the preselection of the applications in accordance with the respective selection procedure and, if necessary, by agreement with the home university of the applicant. Upon preselection the applicants are expected to apply directly to the Baden-Württemberg Foundation. The final approval rests with the Baden-Württemberg Foundation.
